

Present Perfect

already (+) / yet (- & ?) / just

already and just go before main verb.

(Sometimes you can use either depending on the context)

yet at the end of a sentence.

1. Have you paid the rent **__yet__**?
2. I have **__just__** seen Mary in the market, 10 minutes ago.
3. I have **__already__** paid the bill.
4. John has **__just__** called. He can't come to the restaurant with us, he's still working.
5. Has Morris finished his studies **__yet__**?
6. My brother has **__just__** bought a new car but he hasn't driven it **__yet__**.
7. Maria has **__just__** phoned from Italy. She said she is coming home on Friday.
8. Have you had lunch **__yet__**?
9. I can't go to Spain. I have **__already__** booked two tickets for Italy. I booked them a few months ago.
10. Have you seen the new James Bond film **__yet__**?
11. The concert will start in two hours but the singers haven't arrived **__yet__**.
12. Another postcard! Juan has **__already__** sent me six!
13. I've **__already__** had three cups of coffee today.
14. Don't make a mess! I've **__just__** finished cleaning the flat.
15. The group has **__already__** visited two museums today, so they don't want to go to another.
16. She hasn't had her vaccination **__yet__**.
17. I have been to Norway but I haven't been to Sweden **__yet__**.
18. Have you tidied your bedroom **__yet__**?
19. I've **__just__** been to David's house, but there was nobody at home.
20. We have **__already__** tried to contact her twice.
21. Has your new boyfriend met your parents **__yet__**?
22. Laura's **__just__** arrived home from work. She's really tired.

24. We've **__already__** seen this film twice.
