Present Perfect

<u>already (+) / yet (- & ?) / just</u> <u>already</u> and <u>just</u> go before main verb. (Sometimes you can use either depending on the context)

<u>yet</u> at the end of a sentence.

1. Have you paid the rent __yet__?

2. I have __just__ seen Mary in the market, 10 minutes ago.

3. I have <u>already</u> paid the bill.
